## **Louisville Welcomes JAMfest Dance Super Nationals**

Nearly 4,000 dancers and their families will converge on downtown Louisville this weekend for JAMfest Dance Super Nationals for the first time. Formerly hosted in Northern Kentucky and in St. Louis, JAMfest is elated to bring this event to their home base of Louisville. JAMfest Dance Super Nationals is the largest all-star dance competition in the USA. This event is devoted specifically to dancers, and the weekend will boast over 400 performances in a variety of dance styles from Lyrical to Hip Hop from both school and all star teams, as well as solos, duets and trios. The event will be held at the Kentucky International Convention Center, and will last from approximately 8 am – 9 pm on Saturday and Sunday. This event will feature dance teams of all ages from Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Missouri, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and Wisconsin. You can also check seven dance teams that are traveling all the way to Louisville from Japan! Teams will compete for National Champion titles in their respective divisions and for overall Grand Champion awards. Each team will compete once on Saturday and once on Sunday. Routines will be scored and critiqued by a panel of respected national judges in the dance industry. National Champions will receive a national champion trophy and banner, as well as individual jackets.
